	c. Attend a minimum of fifty (50 hours) of classroom and field instruction.		
	d. Complete open-book, take-home tests, given on specific subjects on class days.		
	e. Give a minimum of fifty (50) hours of volunteer service at GCMG approved projects within one year of completing the training program; and record the volunteer hours worked in a timely manner, using the Volunteer Management System (VMS).

	a. Use the knowledge I gain to educate the public on sound horticulture practices and do my best to accomplish the GCMG mission and goals.			
	 b. Continue as an active member of the GCMGs by: Performing a minimum of twenty (20) hours of volunteer service annually; Attending at least ten (10) hours of approved continuing education annually; Reporting volunteer hours in a timely manner (at least once a month before the end of each month); Paying annual local dues, currently \$25.00, prorated (\$12.50) if certification occurs for a partial year; Applying for and completing the Extension Volunteer Standards Course (EVS) and your personal background check every three years, or as required by the Texas AgriLife Extension.

Fill out this application in legible print, answering each question as thoroughly as possible. Or on-line, see below.*

Mail, hand deliver, or email your completed application(s) with payment or proof of payment: <u>Now through Nov. 1, 2024</u>, early bird rate of \$250(10% discount for military =\$225) or \$420 for two applicants. <u>Nov. 1 through Dec. 31, 2024</u>, regular rate of \$275(10% discount for military =\$247) or \$480 for two applicants. <u>Jan. 1 through Jan. 21, 2025</u>, late fee rate of \$295, no discounts available.
